



GUIDELINES FOR POSTER PRESENTATIONS

1. Poster Viewing Session

Poster Viewing Session will take place during the tea breaks throughout the Research Week. All authors are expected to be at their posters during this time.

2. Poster Presentation

A poster should disclose key messages at first sight.

The poster should be a visual presentation of your submitted abstract and should cover the following:

- ❖ **Title:** The title should reflect the content of your poster and match your abstract submission;
- ❖ **Contact Information:** Name, organisation or institution, e-mail address of the corresponding author and the institutional affiliations of all co-authors should appear on the poster;
- ❖ **Contents:** The poster should contain the study aims, methods, results and conclusion. All contents should be simple and not overburdened with details – “minimising detail maximises information transfer”;
- ❖ **Lettering:** Posters should be typed in clear print that can be easily read. Font Times New Roman must be used. The title should be of font size of at least 40 and the text at least font size 16;
- ❖ **Graphics:** Use illustrations and photos of high quality;
- ❖ **Poster size:** The poster must of A1 size (594 mm x 841 mm) in **portrait orientation**.

3. Poster Printing

Upon presentation of receipts, you can claim refund for the costs incurred for printing your poster(s) up to a maximum of MUR 1,000.

4. Presentation Assessment and Award

Awards will be given for the “Best Poster Presentation” and “Most Innovative Poster Presentation” based on feedback from at least two assessors who will evaluate each poster using a rubric.
